

### 2. Registration Week Schedule (September 14th – 21st)

- ② Please be on time for the Chinese level streaming test. Table 1 includes information on the time and place.
  - International students must take the Chinese streaming test, in Chinese, regardless of major. Those who pass need not take Chinese classes. Those who do not must take either Conversational Chinese (ab initio/basic) or Conversational Chinese (Advanced). Students can only gain credits for the course by attending classes promptly and taking the exams. These foreign language classes are a compulsory shared class to gain a degree.
- ③ Students are asked to attend the individual greeting events for their different majors. These events are an opportunity to get to know the local Chinese students and academic tutors, and to learn a bit about life and events on campus at SISU. Table 2 indicates the time and venue for assignment of master students to different classes and greeting with faculty (assignments for doctoral students is to be informed).

### A. Log in:

- a. Go to the SISU homepage: http://www.shisu.edu.cn
- b. Click "My SISU" at the bottom left corner (highlighted in red) to access the login page.


The username is your student number; your password is the last 6 digits of your passport (whichever one you provided when you applied. If you have renewed your passport since then, please enter the 6 digits of the old passport to login. You can alter your password after logging in).



c. Within the "Teaching Management" section at the bottom, click on "Graduate Student Management" (highlighted in red).



### B. Navigate to the "Basic Student Details" – My personal details – Personal details, and update as necessary.



- a." Identification expiry date: refers to your passport. Please fill in accurately. (Check that the "Passport Number" listed is the same as your current passport. If it is out of date or incorrect, please contact the staff responsible to have your details amended see the end of this document).
- b. In the "Mobile phone number" column please fill in your Chinese mobile number so that we can get in touch or notify you of important issues in the future.
- c. In the "E-mail" column please fill in your usual e-mail so that we can get in touch or notify you of important issues in the future.
- d. "Residence in Shanghai" fill in your current address in Shanghai, in detail, including street and apartment number.
- e. Fill in the "Emergency Contact" and "Emergency Contact details" (We will contact this person in the event of a serious situation or other emergency, and immediately offer assistance. Please leave a telephone number).

Please fill in the above information and click "Save" button for information saved.

If there are spelling errors or other inaccuracies in your basic information, such as your name, student number, or passport number (details that require your permission to amend), please send the incorrect details along with the new version to: <a href="mailto:songliang\_roger@126.com">songliang\_roger@126.com</a>. For changes to your name and passport number we require a scanned copy or photograph of your passport photo page. If you have any other problems, you can ask a local Chinese student on your course for assistance or dial 35373123 and ask for Mr. Song (Roger).

#### 3. Information about Course Selection

A. During your time at SISU you will take a combination of course-specific electives, and joint electives. Your course classes include basic, specialized, and specialized electives, as well as other compulsory courses. The joint classes include politics, Chinese and introduction to Chinese culture. Access to different classes varies with the degree. Please carefully read the "Graduate Student Education Plan". You will then need to go through and choose your courses with the direction of your tutor (or if you do not already have an assigned tutor, then with the head of education in your department or the dean), and organize your timetable. For details of your course timetable, please bring your Graduate Student Education Plan to the meet and greet session with the faculty staff, and ask your teachers and classmates for assistance as early as possible.

B. In line with both national Ministry of Education and SISU policy, all first year international students studying courses under politics and applied economics (international politics, international relations, diplomacy, Chinese and foreign political systems, international public management, Middle Eastern research, international trade studies, finance, and applied statistics) must enroll in the Politics module under "Degree Joint Classes". International students who wish to be exempt

from this class should hand in an application and a photocopy of their passport photo page to the Transcripts Office (see table 8 for telephone and location). Table 4 indicates the time and location for Politics classes this semester.

C. SISU has set up Chinese classes (basic and advanced) for students to improve their Chinese. Please choose the course that suits your level. Credits for this course are counted as part of the "Degree Joint Classes". Table 5 indicates the time and location for this class this term.

D. In line with national educational policy, all international students in China must take the "Introduction to Chinese Culture" course. Students on the China Studies course, however, may apply for exemption. The "Introduction to Chinese Culture" course will begin from the second semester.

E. The Transcripts Office will send the guide to selecting courses for international students to your email; the information is also accessible through the graduate student management system. An English version is currently being produced in order to make online course selection easier for international students. The Graduate School will hold a training session in how to select courses for international students at the **Hongkou campus 1#808 at 18:00-19:00 on September 25<sup>th</sup>**; there will be an extension in the deadline for international students to register for their courses. Students who have questions or require assistance can compile a list of their queries and then approach staff for assistance.

The Graduate School will hold a training session for how to select courses at the **Songjiang** campus 4#427 at 19:00-20:00 on September 21<sup>st</sup>. Both international and Chinese students will be at the session. If international students require assistance, they can compile a list of their queries and ask a teacher. Those students who wish to attend the Hongkou campus training session are most welcome.
